Hijazi announced that the PICS Foundation was transforming into the PICS Society, the first global home for doctors, nurses and technologists dedicated to interventional treatment of Congenital Heart Disease (IC CHD). While the Symposium would continue as the flagship event, he set the bar for your new Society to do more—much more.

Dr. Hijazi set some ambitious goals; we have accomplished a lot, and there's much more to come. Here is a baker's dozen of highlights past, present and future.

The PICS Symposium: The annual PICS Symposium is your Society's premiere activity, the leading global event for your profession. Live cases, keynote lectures, hands-on workshops, focused sessions, abstracts and an educational exhibit hall provide "news you can use" on your return home. (Thank you Drs. Ziyad Hijazi, Damien Kenny, the Program Committee, 3Di3 Chairs Drs. Aimee Armstrong & Gregor Krings, the world class faculty, and staff lead Kimberly Ray, RN).

Rapidly Expanding Membership: In a short time, PICS has become the "must join" membership society for your profession, serving as YOUR collective voice to policymakers, within the house of medicine and to the public. Next goal: increase public awareness of the amazing work you do, and your dedication to learning, teaching and striving for the highest quality of care. (Thank you Drs. Lee Benson, Allison Cabalka, Jae Young Choi, Sir Dr. Shakeel Qureshi, Michaeleen Wallig and Dana Kichka).

Clinical Guidelines by You, for You: Few if any activities are more important than clinical guidelines—prepared by those best experienced with the science and dedicated to the patient's best interests. PICS Quality Committee Chair Dr. Ralf Holzer led a PICS-coordinated effort to produce the first clinical consensus statement on cardiac cath for pediatric patients and adults with CHD. A massive undertaking involving several societies and 60+ writers and reviewers, this serves as the definitive framework for quality in your profession. Next up (also led by Dr. Holzer): indications for interventional treatment of CHD, plus other documents determined by Guidelines Committee chair/co-chair Drs. Athar Qureshi and Tom Fagan.

ACHD Interventional Treatment: Under Chair Dr. Jamil Aboulhosn, the ACHD Committee has an ambitious agenda of advocacy, education and guidelines. Now underway: a training

directors global survey led by Dr. Gabriele Egidy Assenza to define future educational programs and training frameworks.

PICS-IPC Istanbul: In 2023 and 2024, PICS partnered with the renowned IPC meeting (Dr. Mario Carminati) and the Turkish Society/Association of Pediatric Cardiology & Cardiac Surgery (Dr. Ahmet Çelebi) to bring key elements of the PICS Symposium to audiences in Asia, Europe and the Middle East. The highly successful PICS-IPC Istanbul meeting will again be offered in 2026.

Professional Education: Education Chair Dr. Dan Levy and his committee have charted an ambitious plan for professional education. Much has been accomplished: expanded online video resources, timely webinars, a deep library of online talks. A prime example is our rapidly growing library of Tips & Tricks that can help you in the lab every day. (Thank you to Senior "Tips" Editors Drs. Guru Hiremath, Sarosh (Shawn) Batlivala, Associate Editor Dr. Kamel Shibbani and Consulting Editor Dr. Jacqueline Kreutzer).

Nurses and Allied Health Professionals (NAHP) Committee: Emily Kish (Chair) and Co-Chairs Curtis Terry Alford, Ileen Cronin and Veronica Zitterman have expanded the membership and activities of this vital committee. Numerous educational activities are planned for Symposium 2024 and beyond.

Early Career Committee: One of PICS' most active groups (Chair Dr. Aimee Armstrong & Co-Chair Dr. Gianfranco Butera), this committee completed the first global survey of training directors (thank you Dr. Varun Aggarwal). 


